

David & Mary M. served our meals with a smile!




Ed Clabaugh, age 70, passed away at his home at Star Ranch on June 8th, 2015.

BEEN HERE?

The town of Abbott is a half mile east of IH 35 & 10 miles south of Hillsboro in south central Hill Country. It is best known as the birthplace of country music writer & singer Willie Nelson. Abbott was founded in 1871 as a stop for the Missouri-Kansas-Texas Railroad and was named for Joseph Abbott a Texas politician, In the 1890s cotton was a major crop in the area. During that decade 2 cotton gins, general stores, doctors offices, drugstore, barbershops, 2 hotels, 2 blacksmith shops, photographer's studio, newspaper, bank & 3 churches. Population at that time was 714. In 1990 the population was 314, it is 360 as of 2013.

May 25, 2015 is a day many people at Star Ranch will not forget. Problems started first thing that morning. With all the rains our RVers on RV row were getting stuck trying to get out and go home.. Between Rod M & David M and loaders they were able to help all get out safely. The rain stopped and didn't start again until everyone visiting made it out to head back to their homes. Late afternoon the rain started again along with strong winds and didn't stop until 6:30 PM. We lost electricity, had uprooted trees, trees that split, bridge railings torn up, roads impassible, flooded cabins and office. It was heartbreaking to see all of this knowing how much work it would take to get Star Ranch put back together again. The next day we had to close the grounds to all visitors for the first time in Star Ranch history. We had an unbelievable crew of members who showed up and started in cutting up trees, working on roads, cleaning out offices, donating generators. Some members cleaned out their refrigerators to help feed the crew. Work continued for 10 days before we could reopen. We could not have done it without all of the members pitching in and helping out. Thank you to all of you.
