Rules for Cook-off:

- ◆ No ingredient may be precooked or treated in any way prior to the commencement of the official cook off, with the following exceptions: canned tomatoes, tomato sauce, pepper sauce, beverages, broth, beans and grinding and mixing of spices
- ◆ Meat or meat substitute may be precut or ground but not treated (seasoned in any way)
- ◆ All other ingredients must be chopped or prepared during the setup and cooking periods
- ◆ You may precook your beans as long as you DO NOT add any spices or treatment while they are being cooked
- ◆ Each contestant will need to provide their own cookware and heating method for the preparation of the chili
- ◆ Each contestant will be responsible for cleaning all of their own cookware and cooking space
- ◆ The chili MUST be cooked on-site the day of the cook off, out in the open
- ◆ Each contestant will be assigned a number by the scorekeeper and given a container in which their chili will be collected at the time of the official judging. Each contestant should verify that the number on the bottom of the container is the same number assigned to them.
- ◆ Cooking starts at 9:30 AM in Tara Hall
- ◆ Judging will be at 1:30 PM
- ◆ Chili Potluck in Tara Hall at 6 PM

- Pie auction at 5:30 PM

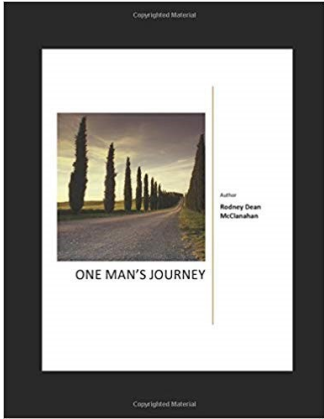
